

2015 Points of Agreement Letter

In 2015, NYCEDC entered into an agreement that established the creation of a Special Purpose Projects Fund that serve the local Sunset Park community.

From the Agreement Letter:

Subject to all applicable legal requirements and the necessary consent and cooperation of third parties, NYCEDC will pursue the following:

community, funding by setting aside and reserving an amount equal to not more than five percent (5%) of the annual gross rent actually received from future SBMT subleases, excluding operating expenses and any amount attributable to any PILOT payments required to be made by the applicable subtenant. NYCEDC will consult regularly with the Task Force on potential uses of the fund.



SBMT Lease Timeline & Special Fund

• SBMT Timeline:

- 2015 SBMT Master Lease between the City and NYCEDC executed.
- 2015 In a Points of Agreement Letter between NYCEDC and NYC Council Member Carlos Menchaca, NYCEDC commits to establishing a fund that sets aside 5% of annual gross revenue generated by SBMT subleases.
- 2015 EDC issues RFP for reactivation of SBMT with industrial maritime uses and selected SSBMT, LP.
- 2019 Lease between NYCEDC and S-SBMT LP executed.
- 2022 Lease with S-SBMT LP was amended and restated to better align with site development for OSW purposes.
- 2022 SSBMT sublease with OSW developer Equinor executed.
- 2024 Equinor to take full possession of the site by April 2024.

Approximate Funds Expected By Calendar Year End:

- Balance as of November 2023: \$116,000
- Anticipated 2024: \$358,000
- Anticipated 2025: \$395,000
- Anticipated 2026: \$405,000
- Anticipated 2027: \$415,000



North Campus

Building A Construction

Construction work ongoing and expected to be substantially complete Q3 2024.

Sitework and Public Realm

Site work including waterfront esplanade and pedestrian realm is ongoing and expected to be substantially complete in Q4 2024.

South Campus (Steiner)

Site Work

Team is making progress towards key pre-development milestones, anticipating a closing in Q3 2024

Steiner commenced abatement at Unit G in February with anticipated building demo in mid-March.

Construction Planning

Steiner is currently engaged in the design development and extensive permits and approvals process and plans to break ground in Q3 2024.

Park Planning

Received PDC approval for park improvements December 2023.

Pier 6

Early Design Phase

Public engagement began with a Town Hall & Workshop on February 12th. A second town hall to discuss update design will happen in the Summer.






Bush Terminal Pier 7

- Project Site: Pier 7 is the remnant of a former earthen pier at Bush Terminal on the Sunset Park waterfront. The pier is in state of extreme disrepair and poses public safety and navigational safety concerns.
- Goals: Remove fill, contaminants, garbage and debris to create marine habitat, and establish a mitigation source to enable permitting of NYC waterfront projects. The mitigation "bank" documents environmental uplift, generating impact offsets and ensuring long-term management and protection of the aquatic environment.
- Status: Seeking state and federal approvals to establish bank site by restoring Pier 7 under a citywide mitigation banking program. The Prospectus for the Citywide Umbrella Mitigation Bank and Pier 7 mitigation program was released by the US Army Corps of Engineers for 30-day public comment available through 3/8/2024.

Green Economy Action Plan

- Today, the City announced the release of the <u>Green Economy Action Plan</u> a first-of-its-kind plan that lays out a roadmap to growing the city's green economy. The plan invests in jobs and sectors that will help the city combat climate change, and train and position New Yorkers particularly those from environmentally-disadvantaged communities to benefit from the nearly 400,000 projected 'green-collar' jobs in New York City by 2040.
- Highlights of the plan include:
 - Establishing a Climate Innovation Hub
 - Creating Green Training Facilities in Every Borough
 - Activating a Harbor Climate Collaborative
 - Activating Public Sites for Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging
 - Creating Tax Incentives for Battery Storage






Climate Innovation at Brooklyn Army Terminal

 Climate Innovation Hub at BAT
 - Seek a consortia to develop and operate the Hub with cutting edge facilities
 - Pilot climate technologies and solutions at this historic industrial site
 - Business development services to accelerate both start up and incumbent climate innovation businesses
 - Create workforce development programming for New Yorkers, including the immediate Sunset Park community, to engage in green job training and opportunities
 - \$100 M in City Capital invested

RAISE Grant ≧/EDC

RAISE Grant Application: One Way Pair, 51st Street Float Bridge/Rail Yard

Convert First And Second Avenues into a pair of one-way streets

- Developed from EDC-led 2016 Sunset Park Transportation Study to provide various safety, circulation, and operational recommendations
- Sam Schwartz study undertaken jointly by EDC and DOT completed in 2022
- First Ave will be redesigned as a northbound street and Second Ave will be redesigned as a southbound street

Rebuild 51st Street Float Bridge, previously damaged by Superstorm Sandy, to resume serving as the hub of Brooklyn Waterfront Rail system

 Activities include transferring cars to and from the car float to New Jersey and allowing transloading by local businesses

Project Benefits:

- The OWP will reduce street congestion; improve traffic flow and safety for pedestrians, bicyclist, and vehicles
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions through use of maritime and rail freight instead of trucks
- Support the creation of good paying jobs in maritime and rail freight
- Increases rail transload
- Reduces "street running"
- Introduces redundancy in float system allowing for regular maintenance reducing risk of service disruption
- Provides for modern track alignment to accommodate larger, modern rail equipment




Status: Actively Pursuing Funding, RAISE Grant application underway



Sunset Park Infrastructure Project Update

- Construction started October 2022 and will be complete in summer 2024
- NYCEDC has retained AECOM to manage the construction work
- Work to be completed in 5 Phases:
 - Scope of work includes: new catch basin installation, removal
 of cobblestones and inactive rails, bike lane and sidewalk
 reconstruction, landscaping and tree planting, street restoration
 work, and enhancing the intersections of 39th and 2nd Ave and
 39th and 3rd Ave.
 - Phase I is approaching 100% completion, work is progressing for various upgrades in the other 4 Phases and currently on target to be completed within the 18-month duration.
